But the lesson here is not justice. **It is about a generosity we can't comprehend.** It reminds me of deathbed conversions. Imagine you are at the bedside of some very misguided soul shortly before his death. He's made every kind of serious mistake. He's been a terrible spouse, an awful father, a poor worker, a religious apostate. Yet at the hour of his death, he is sincerely repenting his many sins. With the emphasis on "sincerely," will this man make it into heaven? If judged by a jury of his peers, he might remain outside heaven's gates. **But God's generosity is far beyond anything we can ever hope to match.** We are thankful for that. *By Paul Pennick*
