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Expectant Waiting and Preparation

Typically, we think of the Advent Season as preparing for Christmas (The coming of the Christ Child). Yes, it is that, but Advent is also so much more. Indeed, it is Expectant Waiting and Preparation for the Coming Of Christ, and that includes His coming as a result of His birth in Bethlehem (Christmas), His coming in the heart of the believer (a personal relationship), and the Return Of Christ at His Second Coming. We need to be prepared and be looking forward to all of these.

Although we predominately spend our time waiting and preparing for Christmas, the Readings for this Sunday (Nov. 29 the first Sunday of Advent) actually focus more on the other two comings of Christ. The Second Reading calls us to prepare/develop our Personal Relationship with Jesus. It calls out that as you “wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ” (read this as ... develop your personal relationship with Jesus), remember that “God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship (relationship) with His Son.”. This enables us to truly know Jesus and discern God’s will for our life. With regard to the First Reading as well as the Gospel, each point to being prepared for the Return Of Christ at His Second Coming. In the First Reading Isaiah says ...”Return (this is Christ’s Second Coming) for the sake of Your servants, ... that You might meet us doing right (being prepared) ...”, while the Gospel also encourages us to be prepared when it tells us to “Watch, therefore; you do not know when the time will come” (for His second Coming).

So ... This year, in our Expectant Waiting and Preparation for Christ’s coming at Christmas, lets also make sure and focus on the growth of our personal relationship with Him so that we are ready “when the Lord of the house is coming” at the end of our life.

Dear Lord: Bless us not only as we yearn to meet your Son at His coming at Christmas, but by also helping us grow in our personal relationship with Him, and through our preparedness for His Second Coming. I pray this in Jesus’ name.

Mass Readings for November 29, 2020:

Reading 1: [IS 63:16B-17, 19B; 64:2-7](#) : You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old. No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him. Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways! Behold, you are angry, and we are sinful; all of us have become like unclean people, all our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is none who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to cling to you; for you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt. Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands.

Responsorial Psalm: [PS 80:2-3, 15-16, 18-19](#) :

R. Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

O shepherd of Israel, hearken, from your throne upon the cherubim, shine forth. Rouse your power, and come to save us. /R/

Once again, O LORD of hosts, look down from heaven, and see; take care of this vine, and protect what your right hand has planted the son of man whom you yourself made strong. /R/

May your help be with the man of your right hand, with the son of man whom you yourself made strong. Then we will no more withdraw from you; give us new life, and we will call upon your name. /R/

Reading II: [1 COR 1:3-9](#): Brothers and sisters: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Alleluia, alleluia. Show us Lord, your love; and grant us your salvation. **Alleluia, alleluia.** [PS 85:8](#)

Gospel, [MK 13:33-37](#) : Jesus said to his disciples: “Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to all: ‘Watch!’”
